Challenges of Women Education

❖ Gender stereotypes and societal Norms: One of the most persistent barriers to women education is the deeply entrenched gender stereotypes and societal norms. these norms often dictate that a women role is



- primarily in the household, leading to power investment in their education. Girls are discouraged from perusing education beyond certain levels of fields deemed inappropriate.
- **Economic Constraints:** Economic barriers remain a substantial challenge for many women and girls. Poverty and the associated costs of education, including tuition, transportation, and supplies, can be insurmountable. In many cases families prioritize the education of male children over females due to these financial constraints.
- ❖ Lack of access and infrastructure: Inadequate access to schools and educational infrastructure is another major obstacle. Rural areas, in particular, often lack proper educational facilities, leaving many girls without a nearby school to attend. Furthermore, the lack of sanitation facilities in schools can be a deterrent for girls, affecting their attendance.
- **Early Marriage and Childbearing:** Child marriage and early motherhood are significant impediments to a girl's education. In many cultures, girls are married off at a young age, resulting in early pregnancy and childbirth, which disrupts their educational pursuits.
- ❖ Poverty: Female students suffer a lot due to the poor economic status of their family. Consequently, parents of poor household unable to bear expanses for their daughter' education. Such economic inability leads parents to the early marriage of their daughters. In this way, parents with the low economic status unable to further their daughter educational pursuance.
- ❖ Lack of women safety: Women safety and security are the foremost important things in any educational institutions. Very often, guardians worry for the safety and security of their daughters in any educational institutions. Gender based disparities, cultural norms, sexual harassment and sexual assault threaten safety and equality of girls which act as a barrier for their education.
- ❖ Child marriage: Child marriage is acting as the curse of girls' life. It is not only the denial to their educational rights but also denial of their well-being and life itself. Due to the early marriage girl children unable to continue their education. Consequently, they get pregnancy at a lower age, which further breeds often pregnancy death and diseases.
- ❖ Lack of communication in remote areas: Female students who belongs to the hills, peripheral villages and remote areas have often faced the problems of communication. Girls has been facing difficulties to reach the schools which are located in these areas. Thus, transportation and communication issueare the key barrier in the advancement of women education.
- ❖ Illiteracy: Illiteracy is a major curse of human society. Illiteracy makes one ignorant an unconscious. Thus, guardians' ignorance and illiteracy act as a major barrier for their daughter's education. Illiterate guardians have lack of vision which obstructed their daughter educational proceedings and pursuits.
- **Conservatism:** Conservative attitude and unscientific temper of society and peoples are always contrary to the social mobilization and development. Such kind of conservative mentality has been demotivating the female education. Hindrances in the expansion of women education.
- ❖ Insufficient women teacher: In most of the schools we found that there are no sufficient women teachers, which discourages the parents to sent their daughter in schools. So, this is another key issue of female education which has obstructed the girls educational process.
- ❖ Lack of educational institutions: In hills and remote villages there have no significant educational institutions placed. Therefore, many girls' students and learners remain out of the jurisdiction of education. Thus, lack of educational institution is another vital issue of women education.
- ❖ Incompatible Curriculum: Incompatible curriculum is another factor which creates pressure on the girl's learners in the educational institutions. Considering various kinds of girl students' needs and



compulsion curriculum should be framed as incompatible curriculum and syllabi obstructed the female education.

- ❖ Problem of wastage: In most of the cases, many households has been keeping their daughter away from educational institution. Guardian compels their daughter to engage in the task of domestic jobs. In such a way many female learners never ever have admitted in schools.
- **Lack of incentives**: There is a lack of initiation and incentives for girl's education and mobilization. This is another issue, acting as the obstacle of women education.

Recommendations of Women Education:

Radhakrishnan Commission (1948-1949)

In independent India first commission on education was Radhakrishnan commission on chairman of Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan. Recommendations of this commission on women education are:

Amenities of life: The ordinary amenities of life should be provided for women in colleges originally planned for man but to which women are being admitted in increasing numbers.

Educational opportunities: There should be no curtailment in educational opportunities for women but rather a substantial increase in them.

Educational guidance: There should be an intelligent educational guidance by qualified men and women to help women to get a clear view of their real educational interests and to provide good education according to their needs and capacities.

Normal place in society: Women should be helped to find their normal place in society, both as citizens and as women.

Cultural and social responsibility: Men should be encouraged to extend right courtesy and social responsibility in mixed colleges.

Equal in co-educational institutions: In co-education institution, due weightage should be given to women.

Equal salaries: Women teachers should be paid the same salaries as male teachers for equal work.

Measures to promote women education in India:

- Opening of more schools a primary school for 300 pupils, a middle school for 1500 pupils within the radius of 3 miles and a secondary school within a range of 5 miles.
- Appointment of more women teachers.

- ► Free education to girls.
- Gaining community support for girls' education.
- ► Flexibility of curricula and school hours.
- Enforcement of Compulsory Education Act.
- Separate schools for girls.
