However, disparities still exist due to social and structural inequalities. This supports the argument of Amartya Sen (2006), who highlighted that social

inequalities in India often intersect with cultural differences, affecting access to education. The study also highlights the impact of cultural diversity on curriculum and teaching practices. Although some efforts have been made to include diverse perspectives, the extent remains moderate. According to National Council of Educational Research and Training (2005), curriculum reforms should reflect cultural plurality to ensure inclusiveness and relevance.
